

# 2025 Spring Immunization Guide

Comprehensive Student Health Services

# Overview

As a reminder, Florida Statute 1003.22, Rule 64D-3.046 of the Florida Administrative Code, and school board policy 5320 collectively require that every child entering, attending, or transferring into school in grades kindergarten (KG) through 12 must have a Florida Certificate of Immunization (DH Form 680) indicating the student has met the immunization requirements for the required grade level.

Each October, Florida Statute 1003.22 requires the District to submit an annual immunization report of compliance to the Florida Department of Education.

- Students entering Kindergarten Fall 2025 must obtain the 2nd MMR (<u>Mumps</u>, <u>Measles</u>, and <u>Rubella</u>) and the 2<sup>nd</sup> <u>Varicella</u> vaccine.
- Students entering the 7th grade Fall 2025 must obtain the <u>Tdap</u> booster (<u>Tetanus</u> <u>Diphtheria</u> <u>Pertussis</u>) vaccine.
- Students in <u>ALL grades</u> with an **expired** immunization status must present a <u>new</u> Florida Certificate of Immunization-680 form.

# Initial School Entry Health Exam (DH-3040)

Must be performed within twelve (12) months by a medical provider.

# MUST include a tuberculosis clinical screening only.

☐ Based on the outcome of the TB questionnaire screening, the medical provider will determine if the student needs the TB test (injection).

A positive (+) screening test will require a follow-up skin test.

The student may enroll <u>ONLY</u> with a medical provider's statement that the student is free of communicable tuberculosis and can attend school.

 Students transferring from within the state of Florida or a student that was previously enrolled in M-DCPS are <u>NOT</u> required to be reexamined.



#### Florida Certification of Immunization (DH-680)

Students enrolling in school for the first time or transferring into:

M-DCPS from out-of-state <u>MUST</u> present <u>one</u> of the following:

## 1.Part A- CODE-1

☐ <u>ALL</u> immunization requirements are met. No additional immunizations are needed at this time.

# 2.Part B-CODE 2

☐ Temporary Medical Exemption, the student must have a <u>valid</u> immunization code.

## 3.Part C-CODE 3

- ☐ Permanent Medical Exemption- child cannot receive one or more vaccines.
- The medical provider must indicate on the Florida Certificate of Immunization which vaccine the student is medical exempt from receiving.

#### 4.CODE 4

- ☐ Religious Certificate of Immunization (DH-681)
- Issued <u>ONLY</u> by DOH for a child who is not immunized because of his/her family's religious beliefs.



PLEASE NOTE: The Florida Certificate of Immunization MUST match the immunization code inputted in DSIS.
